Speaking on the occasion MWS Secretary, Mamata Riba Naksang gave an overview of the initiatives of the MWS. She said that with an objective to work for upliftment of the women, children, youth, disabled and weaker sections of the society, Muskan Welfare Society, which has the privilege to have Padma Shree, Ms. Mamang Dai, noted social workers, senior women officers of the State Govt. and medical practitioners among its members was formed in 2008.
