GOVERNOR REVIEWS BHALUKPIONG-TAWANG ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Itanagar, October 27: The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh General (Retd) J.J. Singh reviewed the Bhalukpong-Tawang road construction with Border Road Organization (BRO) Officials at Tawang today on 27th October 2012.

Chief Minister Nabam Tuki, Tourism Minister Pema Khandu, WRD Minister Newlai Tingkhatra, UD Minister Rajesh Tacho, Parliamentary Secretaries Tsewang Dhondup, T N Thongdok, P D Sona, Jambey Tashi, R T Khunjuju and Phurpa Tsering, Principal Secretary Yeshi Tsering and Secretary to Governor cum Planning Secretary Ankur Garg, BRO and army officials, besides officials of the district administration and Head of Departments attended the meeting, **reports PRO to Governor.**

Emphasizing the importance of the Road, in regard to development of the western part of the State, its importance to the State tourism and also for national security, the Governor called for expediting the process. He told the concerned organization that people have come to him expressing concerns on the slow process of the work. The Governor, who have been in touch with the Defence Ministry for the early completion of said road, advised the BRO to have a time frame for project implementation.

The Chief Minister Tuki taking part in the discussion assured to facilitate in accelerating the administrative hindrance in the project implementation.

Earlier, the BRO officials apprised the Governor and the Chief Minister on the Bhalukpong-Tawang road project.

Later in the day, the Governor, who inaugurated the Five-Day Tawang Festival yesterday, along with Chief Minister and other dignitaries visited the world renowned Tawang Monastery and paid obeisance at the Dukhang, the main prayer hall of the Monastery. The Governor had a long interactive session with Head of Tawang Monastery, Rev. Guru Rimpoche and other senior Lamas for maintenances of the Monastery and its spiritual importance. The dignitaries later had lunch with the monks at the Monastery.

Later, the Governor witnessed the monastic dances, performed by the Lamas at Douche of the 17th century Monastery, **adds the report.**
