Governor presents Rajya Puraskar award to thirty Scouts, forty Guides, two rovers and seven rangers

Itanagar, December 12: The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh General (Retd) J.J. Singh gave away the Bharat Scout and Guide Rajya Puraskar to thirty scouts, forty guides, two rovers and seven rangers in an impressive function at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar on December 10 last. The Rajya Puraskar is the highest State level awards for scouts, guides, rovers and rangers. State First Lady Anupama Singh Commissioner cum Secretary Education Shri Ganesh Koyu, Secretary to Governor Shri Ankur Garg, Director School Education Shri T. Taloh, who is also the State Chief Commissioner for Bharat Scout and Guides, guests and invitees, government officials, teachers, scout and guide masters and trainers, rovers and rangers scouts, guides, cubs and bulbuls attended the 14th Rajya Puraskar Award ceremony, **reports PRO to Governor.**

Speaking on the occasion, the Governor said that the spirit of harmony and tolerance has been the hallmark of India and all should strive to uphold these values. The nation needs the contribution of every individual to strengthen every social fabric of the nation. The Scout & Guides movement is providing the youth with the physical, mental, intellectual and moral values to face the challenges of life ahead. He added that scouting and guiding in India is not merely a programme of the youth but also a way to sensitize the society about its own evolution. Through its activities like, community development, literacy programmes, health awareness campaigns, and accidents and calamity relief, the Bharat Scouts and Guides have been fostering in our society a new culture of work, a refreshingly different attitude. It is an education system based on respect and relevance for children, a system which will help each one blossom according to one's best potential. An education system fit for a vibrant democracy which will develop children to be responsible and progressive citizens of the country.

Congratulating the recipients of Rajya Puraskar Award, the Governor said that the award is the fruit of your hard work, dedication, and disciple and recognition of their excellent work in the field of Social Service and Community Work.
