ARUNACHAL PRADESH GOVERNOR MEETS J&K GOVERNOR, CM

Srinagar, July 28: Arunachal Pradesh Governor General (Retd.) JJ Singh, who is on an official tour to Jammu and Kashmir met the Jammu and Kashmir Governor NN Vohra and Chief Minister Omar Abdullah at Raj Bhavan, Srinagar on 28th July 2012. They discussed on developmental issues and cooperation. Arunachal Pradesh Governor General Singh, who has been promoting Arunachal tourism, is leaving no stone unturned to see ways and means boost the tourism in the State. Like Jammu and Kashmir, which is renowned for its tourism, Arunachal Pradesh has huge potential for it. This Frontier State has advantage over J & K. It is one of the most peaceful States in the country. At the same time, it also has huge potential for hydropower generation.

On the occasion, Jammu and Kashmir Governor N N Vohra released A Soldier's General—the autobiography of his Arunachal Pradesh counterpart General (Retd) J J Singh. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Senior officers from the army, police, civil administration and people from literary circles were present at the book release function.
