For that, Governor said that local population has to be energised and encouraged to partake in the development process. The spirit of 'Athiti Deva Bhavo' has to be further strengthened. On the developmental issues, the Governor said road connectivity is vital for the district as well as for tourism and hydropower. He stressed on concerted effort at all levels in removing the impediments such as forest clearance and land acquisitions in the implementation of road projects.
