The Constitution of India also prescribes a clear division of power between the Union and States by defining the legislative relations, administrative relations and financial relations. It is, by no means a rigid Constitution, which is evident from the fact that it has already undergone many Amendments till date.

Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, popularly known as Babasaheb, who was Independent India's first law minister and the principal architect of the Constitution of India, immensely contributed in its drafting. The 'Constitution Day' celebration will be a tribute to Dr. Ambedkar, who played a seminal role in the framing of the Indian Constitution as the Chairman of the Drafting Committee of Constituent Assembly, and all other members of the Constituent Assembly, who also contributed immensely to the framing of the Constitution, the Governor said in his message.
