The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Brig. (Dr.) B.D. Mishra (Retd.) commended the General Officer Commanding 4 Corps Lt Gen DS Rana, AVSM, YSM, VSM and General Officer Commanding 5 Mountain Division Major General AK Singh, SM for organising the 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' Cycle expedition of 75 Army-Civil cycle riders from Thakurbari in Assam to Balem, West Kameng District, one of the last villages in the international border with Bhutan. The Governor, who initiated the programme to take the festivity of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' to the last village in the border, also appreciated the Deputy Commissioner of West Kameng District Shri Karma Leki for adding people's participation in the programme.

The Governor's move to attend the flag-in ceremony, had to be cancelled first for the technical snag in the Global Vector Helicopter requisitioned for the purpose and then the alternative IAF helicopter also could not take off due to inclement weather.
