**Governor, First Lady participate in SIR**

**Governor appeals all eligible citizens to actively participate in the Special  
Intensive Revision**

**Public participation is essential for the success of the revision exercise and that every citizen has a responsibility to contribute towards strengthening democratic institutions: Governor**

Participating in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral roll, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt Gen KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), along with the First Lady of the State, Smt Anagha Parnaik, filled their Enumeration Forms at Lok Bhavan, Itanagar, on 25th June 2026. The enumeration process was conducted by the Papum Pare Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Election Officer (DEO), Yupia, Shri Lobsang Tsering, along with the Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) of the 13-Itanagar (ST) Assembly Constituency, Smt Dani Rikang, under the directions of the Election Commission of India.

By personally participating in the exercise, the Governor underscored the importance of every eligible citizen taking part in the democratic process and ensuring that electoral records remain accurate and up to date. He said that public participation is essential for the success of the revision exercise and that every citizen has a responsibility to contribute towards strengthening democratic institutions. Electoral rolls are not merely administrative records but the very basis of free, fair, and transparent elections, he said.

Appealing to the people of Arunachal Pradesh, the Governor urged all eligible citizens to actively participate in the Special Intensive Revision, which commenced across the State on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2026 and will continue until 14<sup>th</sup> July 2026. He expressed confidence that the people of Arunachal Pradesh, known for their civic responsibility and democratic spirit, would extend their wholehearted cooperation to make the Special Intensive Revision a success and further strengthen the foundations of participatory democracy in the State.

The Governor called upon residents to cooperate fully with Booth Level Officers (BLOs) during their house-to-house visits and to promptly provide the required information and documents. He appealed particularly to young and first-time voters to come forward, verify their details, and ensure their names are correctly included in the electoral roll so that their voices are represented in the democratic process.

The Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Election Officer, Yupia, informed that the draft electoral roll will be published on 21st July 2026, after which claims and objections, if any, may be submitted in accordance with the prescribed procedure.
